The Museum is hosting three free space-themed exhibitions during the 68th International Astronautical Congress 2017:

### Shared sky

22 September 2017 – 28 January 2018

Aboriginal artists from the Mid-West region of Western Australia and African artists from South Africa have created artworks in response to ancestral stories about the night sky.

### Dr Andrew Thomas

15 September 2017 – 28 January 2018

Adelaide-born Astronaut Dr Andrew Thomas was the first Australian citizen in space. See his personal memorabilia from his space flights and training, including the space suit worn by him on Mir.

### Space: eyes on the sky

22 September 2017 – 28 January 2018

The SA Museum, the European Space Agency and the Museum of Discovery present images from the Hubble Space Telescope paired with artwork by UniSA students.
