The didjeridu is the iconic sound of Australia. From a stringybark forest in Arnhem Land to the concert halls of Europe, the sound of yidaki (didjeridu) speaks of the landscapes and cultures of Australia and its First People.

A collaboration between the Sound Australian Museum and the Yolngu people, this special exhibition explores yidaki through sound, story, moving image and rarely seen treasures from the South Australian Museum's collection.
